### LA COUNTY BLACK BIRTH WORKER'S COMMUNITY

Maternal Mental Health NOW launched the Black Birth Workers (BBW) Advisory Council, consisting of ten care professionals who serve Los Angeles' Black birthing community.

The advisory council informs program development in a co-design model to create community, build capacity, and provide support to Black birth workers in order to improve access to holistic, culturally congruent perinatal mental health care for Los Angeles County's Black birthing population.

## ONLINE TRAINING LEARNING PATHWAYS: Perinatal Mental Health 101 & 201

Maternal Mental Health NOW and the UCLA +Dept of Mental Health (DMH) Prevention Center of Excellence developed two free, easily accessible, and sustainable online training learning pathways for safety net providers in LA County, enabling them to identify and care for perinatal mental health conditions: Perinatal Mental Health 101: What to Know; and Perinatal Mental Health 201: How To Help.

#### SANA SANA (PERINATAL PEER SUPPORT PROGRAM)

In April 2023, we launched Sana Sana, a supportive peer program for expectant and new families in LA County that provides:

- Culturally congruent and gender affirming support
- → Connections to local resources
- Access to free support groups
- → Weekly follow up
- → Co-created care plan



"Sana sana colita de rana. Si no sanas hoy, sanarás mañana." is a popular nursery rhyme in the Spanish language. Its literal translation is "Heal heal little frog's tail. If you don't heal today, you will heal tomorrow." When presenting on the Sana Sana program at Postpartum Support International's annual conference, a workshop attendee recognized the song from their childhood and sung it for all to hear!



The first few calls that our team of peer supporters fielded were from a group of guidance counselors at various South Los Angeles public high schools. Each caller was calling on behalf of a pregnant student seeking resources specific to this population. In each case, the Sana Sana peer supporter found resources for online support services as well as local in-person support groups that are specifically designated for pregnant teens.





